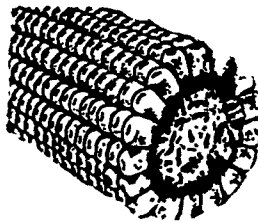
The Society will entertain their Mothers at a luncheon on May 3 at Kreiders. Following the luncheon, they will visit the Robert Fulton House.

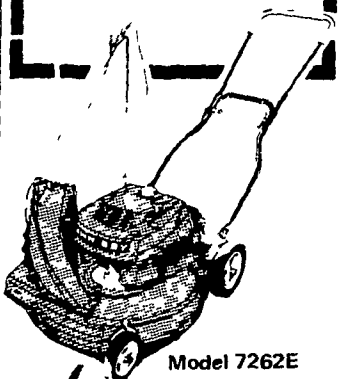

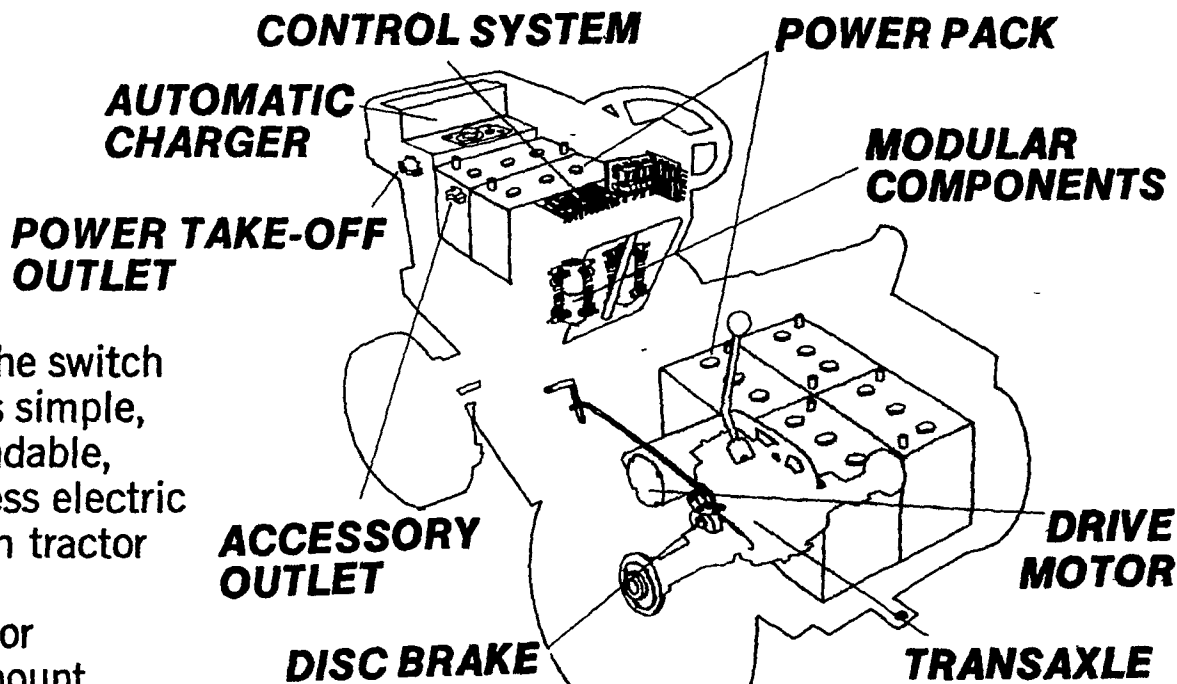
