

## FFA Members Honored For Recordkeeping Abilities

Each year, the Production Credit Association recognizes members of the Future Farmers of America for doing an outstanding job of keeping records on projects carried as part of the vocational agriculture program.

Selection of eligible record books is done on the chapter level, district level, and state level. Grading in the chapter is done by the vocational agriculture teachers, while grading for district and state awards is reviewed by county and state officials along with a representative from Production Credit.

Monetary prizes are awarded by Production Credit to winners in each category. Chapter winners receive \$25, district \$50, and state \$200.
