The Council is made up of 17 members representing a crosssection of dairymen, farm organizations and leading milk cooperatives. Vice chairman is Willis Greaser, Williamsburg, Blair County.

"I look forward to having the Council's thinking and recommendations on matters affecting dairymen and the milk industry in general," Secretary McHale said in announcing formation of the Council. "I expect the Council to propose for Department consideration and action a variety of programs which will benefit our dairymen, who make up the largest single segment of Pennsylvania's \$1 billion agricultural industry."

The Department has similar marketing advisory councils for fruit, vegetables, potatoes, mushrooms, grapes, nursery, stock, poultry, eggs, and roadside
