

## County PP-PS Contest Chooses Area Contestants

Selected members from County FFA Chapters met at the Brownstown Vo-Tech School Tuesday for the annual Parliamentary Procedure - Public Speaking contests.

Five teams gathered for the Parliamentary Procedure contest. The teams and their placings were: Grassland Chapter, first; Cloister Chapter, second; Solanco Chapter, third; Manheim Chapter, fourth, and Pequea Valley Chapter, fifth.

The first and second place teams will compete in area competition between Chester and Lancaster Counties at 1:30 p.m. May 1 at Brownstown Vo-Tech. The top winner in the area contest will be entered in the regional contest May 15 at Lehigh Area Community College.

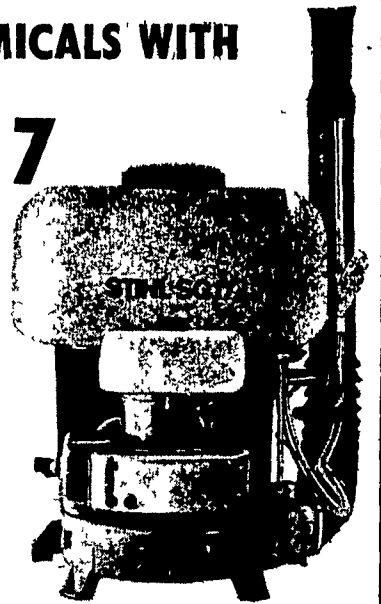
