A new color slide presentation, which shows the role farmers and others in the agricultural complex have played in freeing the American public from the need to grow its own food, has been released by the Photography Division, Office of Communication.

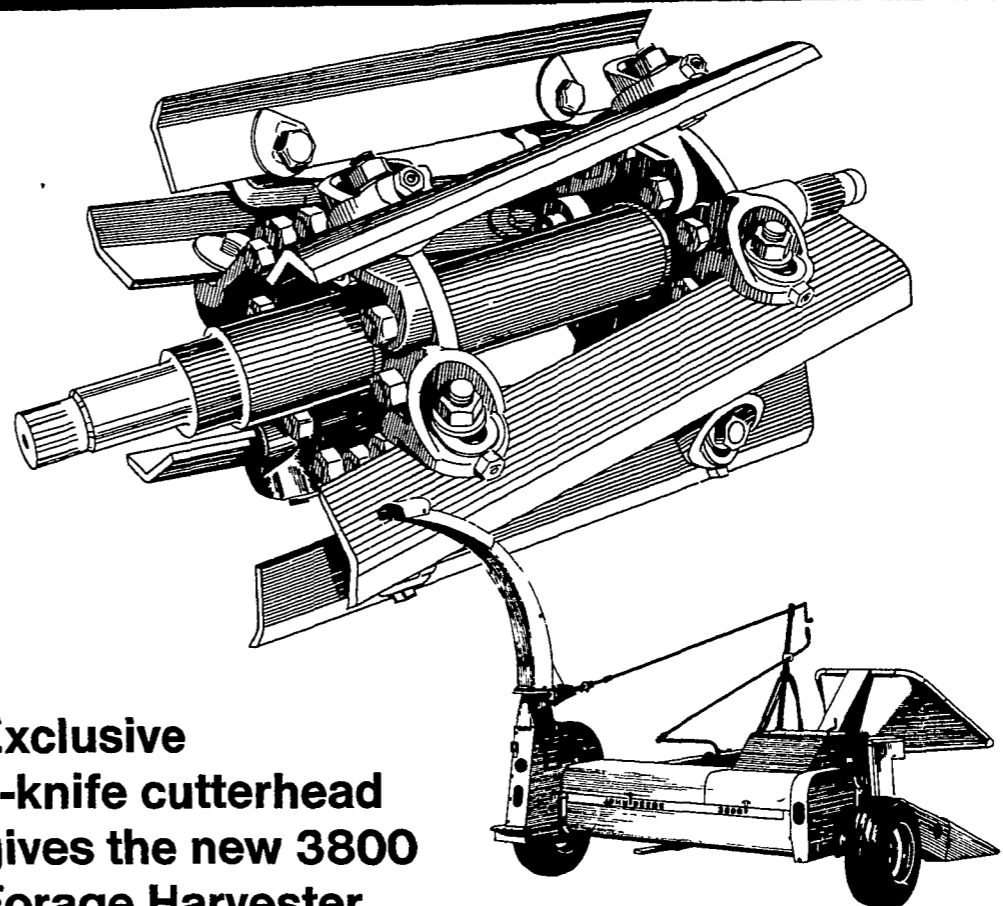
