This is an opinion held by over 75 percent of the American people according to a recent study of consumer attitudes toward dairy products and the dairy industry conducted by the United Dairy Industry Association on behalf of the UDIA family which includes the American Dairy Association, National Dairy Council and Dairy Research Inc.

On the other hand, when asked if they thought the prices of dairy products were too high relative to the prices of other foods, people split almost evenly with 51 percent agreeing and 46 percent disagreeing (3 percent didn't answer). Nevertheless, when asked to react to the statement -"You get good value for your money when you buy milk" - over 82 percent agreed.

These are three of the questions from the study analyzed in a new report - "Public Opinion About Selected Facets of the Dairy Industry" - published by the Marketing and Economic Research Division of UDIA.

In the sudy, 3,500 persons nationwide were asked to respond to some 500 statements about dairy products and the dairy industry on a 6-point scale ranging from definite definite ranging agreement to definite disagreement The current report deals with only 19 of the statements in the study, mostly


