"If all the properties in Lancaster County were reassessed right now, some of our farmers would have to pay so much more in property taxes that thev'd be forced to sell their farms," Amos Funk told a news conference Tuesday morning at the Lancaster Chamber of Commerce.

Funk is chairman of the Chamber's agriculture committee, he is a farmer and is active in a number of local and state conservation / agriculture organizations. The news conference had been called to discuss an amendment to Pennsylvania's constitution which could change the method of taxing the state's farmland.
