**Sen. Schweiker Discusses
Drug Abuse Rehabilitation**

WASHINGTON--The communications gap between parents and children is one of the major causes of drug abuse in America, U.S. Senator Richard S. Schweiker (R-Pa.) asserted.

Schweiker, ranking Republican on the Senate Subcommittee on Alcoholism and Narcotics, said it is important for parents and children "not to make their two worlds so different that one becomes unbelievable or unrelated to the other."

He pointed to the social acceptability of alcohol use as a "double standard" that turns young people to drug abuse. "even though only 10 percent of people who drink become alcoholics, the fact that you're dealing with such a high percentage of the (overall) population (means) you have many more alcoholism problems

than you do drug (problems)," Schweiker said. "I think this is something we hide under the rug; that we forget and explain away. This is part of the parental gap today."

Schweiker made his comments on his monthly radio and television report to Pennsylvania. His guests were Arthur and Ardelle Shultz, directors of Today, Inc., drug rehabilitation program in Bucks County, Pa., and two "graduates" of the program.

Melanie Carson, one of the reformed addicts, cited group therapy as the most important factor in her successful bout with drugs. "That's why I'm still clean today," she said, adding that "encounter groups" helped her develop self-respect, integrity and self-esteem.

Schweiker said, "Peer group

Study Shows Yews Need Sun

One of the most popular ornamental evergreens grown in Pennsylvania, the Thayer yew, requires sunlight more than fertilizer to produce adequate growth, according to five years of studies by Dr. James E. Brewer, assistant professor of ornamental horticulture at The Pennsylvania State University.

Regardless of fertilizer treatment, increase in stem diameter was greater in full sunlight than in shade. Dr. Brewer and associates found that no reasonable amount of nitrogen would overcome this situation. Nitrogen was applied at rates of 200 and 600 pounds per acre. The young yews also received 100 pounds of phosphorus per acre. The young yews also received 100 pounds of phosphorus per acre and 50 pounds of potassium.

While the yew should be started in partial shade in a plant nursery, Dr. Brewer suggests that plant nurserymen remove shade from seedling yews as soon as possible. In this manner the Thayer yew can grow to saleable size in sunlight as rapidly as possible.

The Penn State researchers found that winter damage was greatest among plants receiving 600 pounds of nitrogen per acre. Entire branches and sometimes entire plants were killed by winter injury where 600 pounds of nitrogen were used per acre.

Since the amount of nitrogen used in these studies was purposely very high, the results

should warn growers to be cautious in attempting to "push" yews by applying heavy rates of nitrogen, Dr. Brewer suggests.

He says the various cultivars or varieties of yews have increased greatly in popularity during the past 25 years. As a result, they are now grown in large quantities throughout the Commonwealth. Yews have become one of the most popular evergreens because of their rich, dark green, needle-like foliage and a variety of growth forms. They also tolerate shade, a feature not common to many shrubs.

Club Congress representatives are Wayne Erb, Darwin Nissley and Judy Stoltzfus. Club Congress will be held June 25-28 at Penn State.

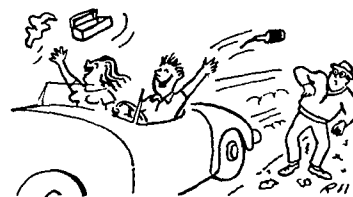
Rachel Brubaker was elected secretary.
