

ASCS Reorganizes

A reorganization of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) was announced recently by ASCS Administrator Kenneth E. Frick. The changes are being made to streamline the agency's structure and improve its services to agricultural producers.

The reorganization was effective June 29.

The administrator said the major changes are consolidation of regions and commodity divisions and a realignment of responsibilities for the three deputy administrators who report to him and Associate Administrator Glenn A. Weir.

Previously, program and management responsibilities were divided among the three deputies. Under the reorganization, each deputy will have sole responsibility in a specific area. The Deputy Administrator for Programs is

Elvin J. Person; the Acting Deputy Administrator for Commodity Operations is Charles H. Turnquist.

The regions have been restructured from five into four in order to reflect the changing agency workload and to more nearly conform with established federal regional boundaries, Administrator Frick said. He identified the four new regions as East, East Central, West Central and West.

The commodity divisions reporting to the Deputy Administrator for Programs are Cotton, Rice and Oilseeds Division; Grain Division; Sugar Division; Tobacco and Peanut Division.

Also reporting to the Deputy Administrator for Programs will be the Defense Operations Division, and The Program Operations Division, as well as two operations, Environmental

Quality and Land Use, and Appeals.

The Deputy Administrator, Commodity Operations, will continue to be responsible for supervision of Commodity Office operations in Prairie Village and Minneapolis, and the procurement, management and disposition of commodities and products.

A Commodity Operations Division will be responsible for the support program for milk and the products of milk, and for transportation and warehouse functions. This division, which reports to the Deputy Administrator for Commodity Operations, also will provide liaison with food and relief agencies at the national level.

Divisions under supervision of the Deputy Administrator for Management are personnel, data systems, fiscal, administrative services and budget. Also reporting to the Deputy Administrator, Management, is the Internal Consulting Staff. Field service offices for personnel, data systems, accounting, claims and administrative services will be located in Kansas City.

Area Youths Appointed to 4-H Posts

Three 4-H members from southeastern Pennsylvania, who served as Leadership School delegates to Pennsylvania 4-H Leadership Congress last week were named advisors to the 1974 Congress to be held next June.

Announcement of the selections, based on leadership and citizenship abilities, was made by Leland G. Jinks, State 4-H Club leader at The Pennsylvania State University.

Named advisors to the 1974 Leadership School were Christine Erb, of RD1, Mount Joy; Darryl Bollinger, of RD1, Manheim; and Wesley McAllister, of RD1, Oxford.

The three will supervise activities of the school which consists of special training in communications skills, understanding social concerns and group processes, and recreation.
