#### OLD FARMER'S WEATHER FORECASTS

New England: Mostly clear and warm to start, then showers by midweek; rain, heavy in north, and cool latter part. Greater New York-New Jersey: Week begins cloudy, then rain by midweek; end of week clear and hot.

Middle Atlantic Coastal: Clear and warm at first, then cloudy and hot; week ends rainy and cooler.

Southeast Coastal-Piedmont: Partly cloudy to start, then temperatures becoming hot; rain and cooler latter part.

Florida: Week begins cloudy and hot, then rain at midweek; rain continuing to end of week.

Upstate & Western N.Y.-Toronto & Montreal: Rain for first part of week; remainder of week cloudy and hot. Greater Ohio Valley: Most of week cloudy with showers; clear

and very hot on weekend. Deep South: Cooler temperatures to start, then heavy rain by

midweek; clear latter part, then rain and cool on weekend. Chicago and Southern Great Lakes: Rain at first, then clear and cool; rainy and hot on weekend.

Northern Great Plains-Great Lakes: Heavy rain to start, then hot temperatures; 1ain and cooler at week's end. Central Great Plains: Week begins rainy and hot, then clear

weather until weekend; rain and hot on weekend. Texas-Oklahoma: Cloudy and hot at first, then heavy rain by

midweek; cloudy with high temperatures to end of week. Rocky Mountain Region: Very hot to start, then thundershowers through latter part; cooler and clear on weekend. Southwest Desert: Week begins cloudy with temperatures in 90s; light rain latter part.

Pacific Northwest: Cloudy at first, then clear and hot by midweek; partly cloudy and cooler latter part.

California: Clear and unseasonably warm to start, then cloudy and cooler through latter part; clear and warm on weekend.

### 1973 United Campaign Goal is \$1.857 million

Jack S. Watson, President of the United Way of Lancaster County, has announced that thirty-six United Way Campaign service agencies will share in this year's goal of \$1,857,040.

The goal was determined after months of preparation and study by the United Way Budget Committee under the direction of Fred R. Bahrenburg, Budget Chairman, and Nelson F. Craige, Vice-President of United Way Planning and Allocations.

Although the goal is up \$183,476 over the actual amount raised in last year's United Way campaign it is \$102,810 below the amount requested by the member agencies.

Budget Chairman Bahrenburg stated: "We carefully reviewed each agency's application for support to evaluate the true minimum need for human services in the year ahead. We realize that people want their gifts to work hard on the local level in the most effective way. The 36 members of the Budget Committee looked hard at business and cash management practices, and we can assure Lancaster Countians that the goal is at a level reflecting true needs."

The United Way of Lancaster County last year served over 131,600 persons, not including the 189,704 persons served by local hospitals, which also receive support.

A breakdown of allocations for United Way services are: Services Families and Children, \$396,459; Health Services. \$451,168; Youth and Group Work Services, \$457,448; Community and Humanitarian Service

agencies, \$305,298; and, Countywide Emergency Services, \$13,800.

In addition, allocations were approved for United Way Campaign costs, \$85,919; General Administration, \$72,548; and Planning and Coordinating Services, \$61,025.

This year's United Way Campaign Chairman, William F. Tell, Manager, Sear's, has accepted responsibility for directing the nearly 5,000 volunteers needed to serve in the fall campaign. Tell stated, "the true essence of the United Way is not only in the hard won dollars we raise but in the valued services our member agencies provide for the people of Lancaster County, Can you imagine how much poorer we would be in spirit and

motivation if we failed to meet the challenge that lies before us. The United Way represents the voluntary way of helping to meet human needs. I'm proud to do my part and I hope all people will join in making our United Way campaign a complete success this year."

The United Way goal is the result of a partnership with the Lancaster County Chapter of the American National Red Cross. Total needs of United Way agencies, plus those of the Red Cross determined the final target of \$1,857,040 for the 1973 campaign.


