# Pa. Broiler Placements Dip 2 pct.

Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending July 14, 1973 were 1,335,000. The placements were 2 percent below the corresponding week a year earlier, but 14 percent above the previous week. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were 8 percent above a year earlier.

Settings for broiler chicks were 2,050,000 - 5 percent above the previous week and 13 percent above the comparable period a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 11 percent above the same period a year ago. Inshipments of broiler-type chicks during the past 10 weeks averaged 1,000 compared with 66,000 a year ago.

Outshipments averaged 296,000 during the past 10 weeks, 13 percent above a year earlier.

Placements in the 21 States were 53,524,000 - 2 percent below the previous week and 7 percent below the same week a year earlier. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were 3 percent below a year ago.

Settings were 71,684,000 - 2 percent above the previous week but 5 percent below a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set if 7 percent below the comparable period a year ago
