

Governor Names Aug. 18-26

Certified Farm Market Week

Freshly picked sweet corn was presented to Governor Milton J. Shapp as he designated August 18-26 as Pennsylvania Certified Farm Market Association Week.

In proclaiming the week, Governor Shapp commended certified markets for their "high standards and endeavors to protect consumers."

Certified markets guarantee their products and operate under a code of ethics which calls for freshness, cleanliness,

reasonable prices and well-informed, courteous personnel. Failure to comply with the code results in loss of verification and membership.

Governor Shapp remarked that there is a strong and rapidly growing trend toward highway retailing. He attributed the trend to relaxed buying, garden freshness and an opportunity for shippers to get out into the country.

Modern drugs have changed the treatment of animals since 1923. "Back then you had to use your head more than drugs," Dr. Clarence J. Bryer says.

Dr. Bryer, 78, of Gap, started to practice veterinary medicine in 1923. Recently, he and another retired area veterinarian, Dr. Carlton C. Ellis, 72, of 2101

Harrisburg Pike, were named honorary members of the American Veterinary Medicine Association.

Dr. Bryer, who was born in Beaver Falls, practiced in Gap from 1925 until he retired in 1967. He received his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1923.

Dr. Bryer, who still lives in the house where he had his office, said he was the first veterinarian in the Gap area. Now, he said, there are about a dozen, including his son, Dr. C. J. Bryer, practicing in the area.

Most of his calls Dr. Bryer said, were for large farm animals. His most frequent patients were dairy cattle.

Among the most unusual incidents in his 47 years as a veterinarian were delivering three two-headed calves and having his leg broken while treating a bull.

Unlike Dr. Bryer, Dr. Ellis did not have a practice. He was involved in research of poultry diseases and was also a college professor.

A professor emeritus of Michigan State University, Dr. Ellis received his doctorate in poultry pathology from Cornell University in 1931.

Dr. Ellis was born in Meriden, Conn. He has done research in New England, New York, Wisconsin and Michigan. He did not come to Lancaster until 1966 when he became a parttime poultry diagnostician for Dr. Wilson Miller in Rohrerstown. Dr. Ellis retired in 1971.

Dr. Ellis, in collaboration with other researchers, developed a drug to prevent coccidiosis in poultry animals.

Washing Baby's Laundry

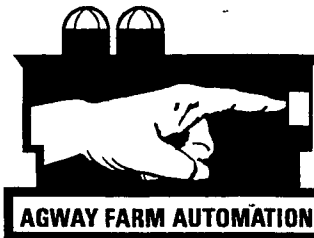
