

Brunthaver to Speak at PennAg Convention

Assistant Secretary of Agriculture for International Affairs and Commodity Programs, Dr. Carroll G. Brunthaver, will keynote the 95th Annual PennAg Industries Association Convention to be held in Lancaster September 12, 13, and 14.

Dr. Brunthaver is deeply involved in the Agriculture Department's efforts to expand U. S. agricultural exports which are running at an all-time high. He believes these exports are a key to the health of the nation's economy.

As Assistant Secretary he oversees the Department of Agriculture's trade and export

expansion work of the Foreign Agricultural Service, The Export Marketing Service and Producer and Commodity Programs administered by the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

Dr. Brunthaver has been in agriculture all his life. He grew up and worked on his family's farm in Ohio. Prior to becoming Assistant Secretary he held positions related to agriculture in business, education and government.

PennAg represents many types of agribusiness throughout Pennsylvania. The convention will be held at the Host Corral in Lancaster. An attendance of 300 is expected to attend the event.
