In Lancaster, the average temperature for the week was 73 degrees, 1 degree above the normal average for the time of year; weekly high was 85 degrees, low 61 degrees.

Growing degree days from April 1 for crops that start at 50degrees totaled 2285, or 58 more than normal in an average year.

Railfall for the week totaled .16 inches; rainfall from April 1 totaled 18.96 inches, or -.53 less than normal.
