Only The Beginning

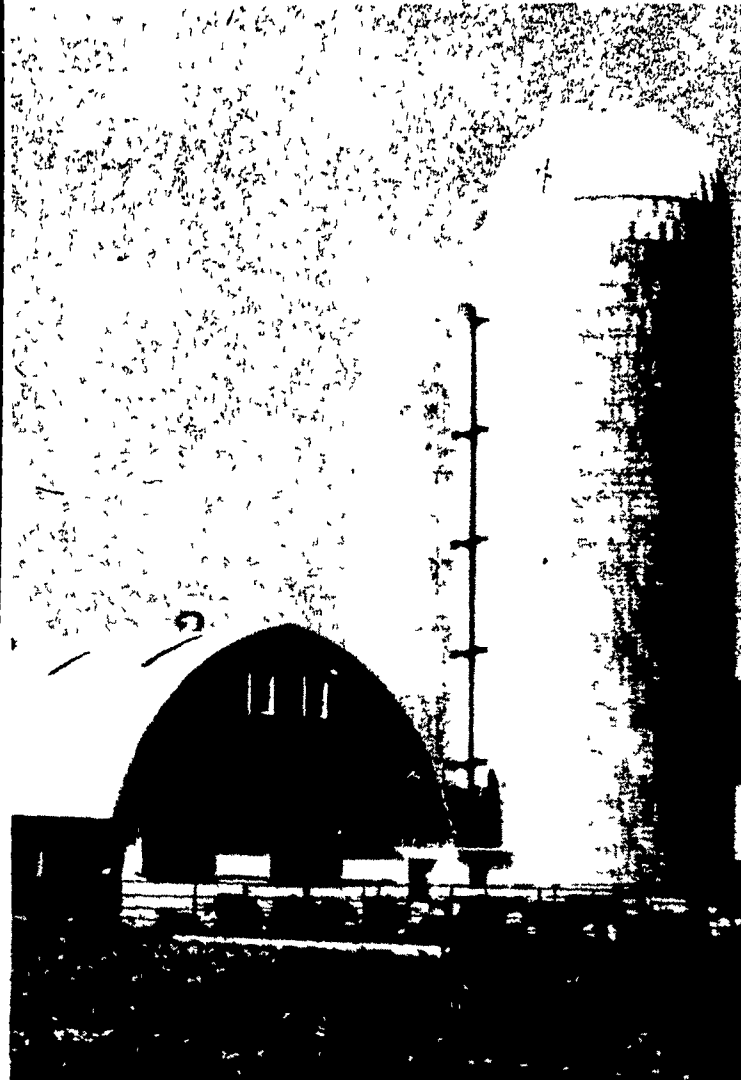
