Molasses Sticky Buns

¾ cup milk, scalded
1-3 cup sugar
1-3 cup butter
1 teaspoon salt
2 packages active dry yeast
1-3 cup warm water (110 to 115 degrees)
1 egg

4 cups sifted flour
¼ cup molasses
½ cup brown sugar, firmly packed
1-3 cup butter

½ cup chopped pecans
Combine milk, sugar, 1-3 cup butter and salt in bowl. Cool to lukewarm.

Dissolve yeast in warm water. Add yeast, egg and one cup flour to milk mixture. Beat until smooth. Gradually add enough flour to make a soft dough. Turn onto floured surface and knead until satiny. Place in greased bowl; turn dough over to grease top. Cover; let rise until doubled.

Combine molasses, ½ cup brown sugar and 1-3 cup butter. Heat until butter melts. Spread mixture in two greased 9-inch cake pans. Sprinkle with pecans.

Combine one cup brown sugar, raisins, and cinnamon; set aside. Divide dough in half. Roll each half into 12x18 inch rectangle. Sprinkle with half of the sugar mixture. Roll up like jelly roll, starting at long side. Cut into 12 slices.

Arrange in prepared pans. Let rise until doubled (30 minutes.)

Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes or until golden brown. Invert pans on plates, remove, cool. Makes 24.

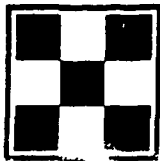

The July 31st edition of American Banker listing the 300 largest banks in the United States will show that Commonwealth National Bank has advanced from 183rd to 179th place in rank.




