Mix all together and bake at 225 degrees for seven hours. Can be baked at 300 degrees for 21/2 hours but slower baking is preferred.

Toasted Nut Spice Cake 2-3 cup shortening

2 cups brown sugar

2 eggs (yolks only)

1 teaspoon soda 11/4 cups sour milk

1 teaspoon vanilla 2 1-3 cup flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon nutmeg ½ teaspoon cloves

34 teaspoon salt

Beat two egg whites until stiff. Slowly add one cup sifted brown sugar and continue beating until smooth. Spread over batter and sprinkle ½ cup chopped nuts over meringue.
