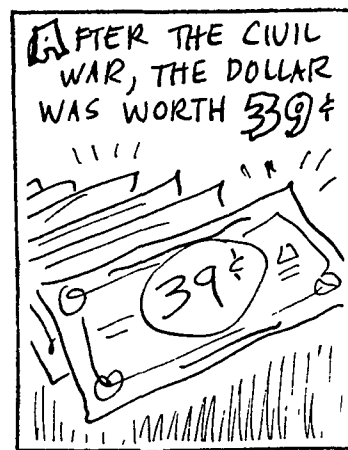

A spot check of international retail food prices in May 1973 as reported by the United States Department of Agriculture revealed the following: In Tokyo, Japan, a pound of sirloin steak is going for the equivalent of \$12.86 a pound. Chuck roast in that city brings \$6.26 a pound. In Paris, France, if you want a pound of bacon it will cost you \$3.09. And in Stockholm, Sweden? If you're planning a breakfast of ham and eggs, you'll find the ham will cost you \$2.59 a pound, the eggs will run about \$1.13 a dozen.
