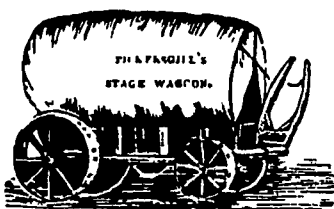




SEPT. 3-9, 1973

**OLD FARMER'S WEATHER FORECASTS**

**New England:** Clear and hot to start, then rain; possible hurricane with heavy rain end of week.

**Greater New York-New Jersey:** Rain and very warm all week; heavy rain latter part.

**Middle Atlantic Coastal:** Week begins cloudy, then rain; hurricane rain on weekend.

**Southeast Coastal-Piedmont:** Rain all week; hurricane expected to hit coast latter part, then clearing and hot on weekend.

**Rocky Mountain Region:** Light rain through midweek; remainder of week clear and warm.

**Southwest Desert:** Light rain and cooling off to start, then gradual clearing with highs near 110 to end of week.

**Pacific Northwest:** Most of week clear and very warm; clear and hot on weekend.

**California:** Cloudy and mild throughout week; clear and hot on weekend.

**FEEDER CATTLE:** Choice 300-450 pound feeder steers 65.00-74.00, Good 300-500 52.00-53.50, Medium 400-650 54.00-61.50, 600-900 45.00-47.00.

**CALVES** 4005, compared with 4063 head last week, and 4440 head a year ago. Vealers mostly \$2 to \$4 lower.

Choice 70.00-81.00, Good 65.00-75.00, Standard 60.00-72.00, Utility 90-120 pounds 50.00-60.50, 70-85 44.00-57.00.

**HOGS** 4200, compared with 6151 head last week, and 6192 head a year ago. Barrows and Gilts \$3.50 to \$4 lower, market very erratic.

**FEEDER PIGS** 1236, compared with 1087 head last week, and 1031 head a year ago. US 1-3 20-35 pound feeder pigs 15.00-30.50 per head, 1-3 35-50 24.50-41.00, 1-3 50-75 32.00-44.00, Utility 20-35 11.00-16.50 per head.

**SHEEP** 1212, compared with 1517 head last week, and 1099 head a year ago. Spring slaughter lambs weak to \$4 lower. Choice 70-100 pound spring slaughter lambs 35.00-42.00, Good 60-100 31.50-39.50, Utility 45-70 25.00-32.50. Slaughter ewes 11.00-23.50.

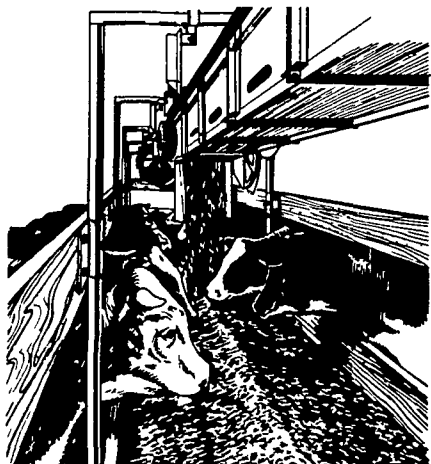
