

## Register for 1973 Fall Workshops

A selection of fall workshop topics have been planned by the Lancaster County Extension Service, with classes to be filled on a first-come basis. All classes will be held in the Extension Training Center at the Farm and Home Center. The Workshops, times and dates, and registration deadlines are:

**Beginning Clothing Construction** -- A series of six classes for those persons with little or no sewing experience. Basic fundamentals taught include using a sewing machine, choosing correct pattern size, making pattern alterations, selecting and preparing fabric, layout, correct cutting procedures, and sewing techniques used in a sleeveless, collarless garment. Classes will be held from 7 to 9 a.m. October 22, 29, November 5, 12, 19 and 26.

Cost is \$15. Registration deadline October 15.

**Intermediate Clothing Construction** -- A series of six classes for the individual who has mastered the basic fundamentals of sewing. Techniques taught include those used in constructing the classic "shirt look"; when and how to use interfacing, simple collar and cuff construction, how to set a sleeve, machine and handmade buttonholes, belts, and working with plaids. Classes will be held from 1 to 3 p.m. October 8, 15, 22, 29, November 5 and 12. Cost, \$15. Registration deadline October 3.

**Cutting to Fit** -- A series of eight classes designed to teach: altering a basic pattern to fit individual figure problems to perfection, draft basic pattern in pellon, use this basic pellon to

know where to alter commercial patterns and use it to create a variety of garments for your wardrobe. Techniques such as those taught in Beginning and Intermediate Workshops are prerequisites for this course. Cost, \$20. Classes will be held from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. October 8, 15, 22, 29, November 5, 12, 19 and 26. Registration deadline, October 3.

**Advanced Clothing Construction** -- A series of five classes presenting dressmaking techniques used on quality fabrics. Learnings include: how to use a designer pattern; when, why and how to underline and line, and couture techniques that produce professional results. Cost \$12.50. Classes will be held from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. October 9, 15, 22, 29, November 6 and 13. Registration deadline October 3.

**Registration Tailoring** -- A series of eight classes presenting the basic principles of construction involved in tailoring a professional looking wool suit or coat. Cost \$20. Classes will be held from 1 to 3 p.m. October 8, 15, 22, 29, November 5, 12, 19 and 26. Registration deadline, October 3.

**Sewing with Knits** -- A series of eight classes presenting the techniques necessary to achieve professional results when sewing with all types of knits available on today's market including the new sweater knits, swimming suits and basic lingerie. Classes will be held from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. October 9, 23, 30, November 6, 13, 20, 27 and December 4. Cost, \$20. Registration deadline October 3.

**Pants that Fit** -- A series of six classes to learn how to draft your own basic pants pattern - designed to flatter your figure, feel comfortable, and fit well; how and when to line; work with

plaids, stripes and border prints; become acquainted with techniques used in constructing pants. Cost \$15. Classes will be held from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. October 10, 24, 31, November 7, 14 and 21. Registration deadline October 3.

**Menswear Clothing Construction** -- A series of four classes designed to present professional techniques used to construct men and boys' slacks, shirts, vests and ties, using double knits. Cost \$10. Classes will be held from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. October 10, 24, 31 and November 7. Registration deadline October 3.

**Tailoring Mens' and Boys' Sport Jackets** -- A series of four classes presenting techniques which will give professional looking results when constructing sport jackets. Cost \$10. Classes will be held from 1 to 3 p.m. October 10, 24, 31 and November 7, with registration deadline October 3. A second series of classes will be held from 7 to 9 p.m. November 20, 27, December 4 and 11, with registration deadline November 14.
