### Days, Rainfall **Growing Degree**

A report from Penn State of weekly crop and weather roundups with a report on weather conditions for the week ending October 1.

In Lancaster, the average temperature for the week was 64 degrees, 3 degrees above the normal average for the time of year; weekly high was 80 degrees, low 41 degrees.

Growing degree days from April 1 for crops that start at 50degrees totaled 2073 degrees, or 126 more than normal in an average year.

Rainfall for the week totaled .36 inches; rainfall from April 1 totaled 23.33 inches, or 01.51 inches less than normal.
