(Continued From Page 24) and said her dairy was packaging horse flies in her milk.

"When the agent visited the lady's home, on a hot summer day, he found garbage cans just outside the kitchen and no screens on the windows. He had to tactfully tell the lady that the dairy had indeed supplied the

milk, but the horsefly was her own."

Mrs. Alexander went on to recount a series of genuine horror stories about snakes in the grapes, katydids in the TV dinners, rocks in the mushrooms and muskrat meat in the hamburger. She said the ag department with its 27 bureaus was trying to do a good job of policing the food industry, but there were two major stumbling blocks.

"Pennsylvania's general food law was passed in 1909. Do you know how many things have changed since 1909? For the past four years, our administration has been trying to get a new food law passed by the legislature. Every year we introduce a bill, and every year it gets shot down."

"Another problem is that we just don't have enough agents to police everybody and everything. If consumers want the quality and quantity they're paying for, they'll have to report violations to the department. We think we have a pretty reliable food industry in the state of Pennsylvania. But we can't catch the violators without cooperation from consumers."
