

## New Scholarships Go to PSU Trio

Three College of Agriculture students at The Pennsylvania State University have been selected to receive new \$500 scholarships. The recipients are Jean M. Persia of Bellefonte, Frederick D. Piper of Hollidaysburg, and David F. Mitchell of Meadville. Each will

receive a United Farm Agency Scholarship.

The new scholarships will recognize promising seniors majoring in animal sciences-veterinary medicine.

Miss Persia is the daughter of Philip M. Persia of RD1, Bellefonte. She is a senior in

animal science with particular interest in veterinary medicine. She had a grade point average of 3.56 out of a possible 4.0 at the end of the spring term 1973.

Mr. Piper is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Foster D. Piper of 224 Mulberry Street, Hollidaysburg. He is a senior in animal science with special interest in veterinary medicine. He attended the Altoona Campus of the University for two years before transferring to University Park. Fred had a grade point average of 3.42 out of a possible 4.0 at the end of the spring term 1973.

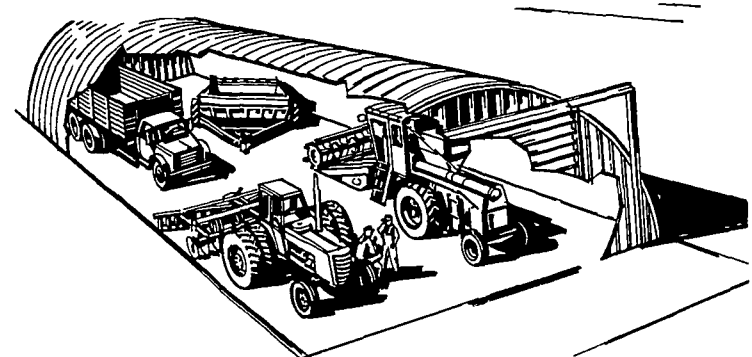
