Members accepted an invitation of a store tour of Hickory Farms at Park City on Monday evening, October 22 at 7:30 p.m.

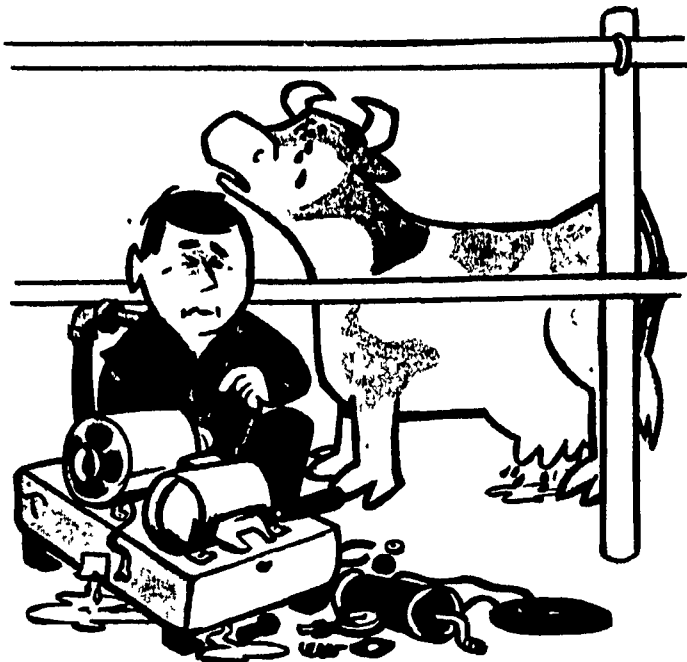
Members voted to give donations of \$5 to United Way and to the Cancer Society, and \$10 to the Fresh Air Children's Fund.

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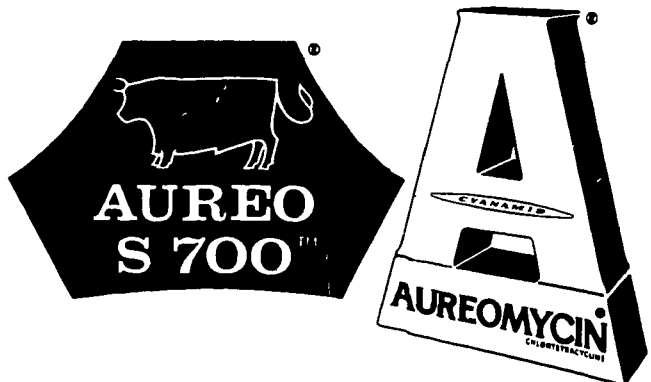
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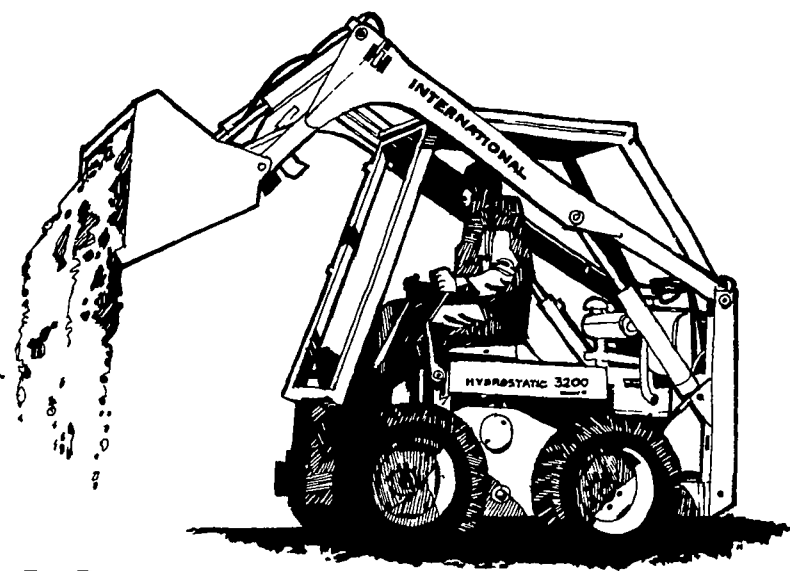
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
