The swine classes at the 17th **Keystone International Livestock** Exposition will be going all out this year to clear their image. The mammoth livestock show pens for a six-day run at the Farm Show Thursday, November

Scattered outbreaks of hog holera in the summer of 1972 orced Expo health officials to eturn nearly 200 entries from thio and Indiana and reduce the ead count of hogs to last place, chind the sheep, horses and beef

In December and January four solated outbreaks of hog cholera vere uncovered in the Comnonwealth and the entire swine epartment at the Pennsylvania state Farm Show was cancelled. But the outbreaks in more than a ozen states were successfully ontained and the entire coninental U.S. is once again out of uarantine. The only USDA suarantine still in effect is the ommonwealth of Puerto Rico.

The important pork producing reas of the east along with :ignificant representation from he south and the midwest cornelt will be back in the Keystone nternational this year improving he species in both quantity and uality.

Host state farmers raditionally make their best howing in the swine classes. For astance, in last year's breeding

classes Pennsylvanians were acclaimed premier exhibitors in six of the seven breeds with Richard P. Sholley, Jonestown, Lebanon County, copping the accolade for both the Poland China and Spotted Swine breeds. Sholley also showed the champion boar in these two breeds.

Another big winner in the '72 Expo was Reno H. Thomas, a mid-state farmer-legislator who grabbed all of the top prizes for Yorkshire and breeding stock. The Beavertown, Snyder County, pork producer also took the grand championship in the live judging of market-ready hogs.

The revised schedule of events for the 1973 show, November 8-13, will have all of the swine breeding classes showing on Friday and Saturday in the small arena. The barrows competition will continue to be held Sunday and Monday with the truckload judging first followed by the individual classes.

Nearly half of the barrows in the live judging will be immediately shipped to a nearby slaughterhouse and meat experts will make an evaluation of the carcass. Grand championship of the on-foot (live) classes is good for \$50 and a plaque. Grand championship of the on-rail judging is worth \$1,000 and a plaque.
