Manheim RD2 Man, 82, Dies In Farm Mishap

An 82-year-old Manheim RD2 farmer was killed Thursday morning when his tractor rolled over him.

According to state police, Jacob M. Dupler was pronounced dead at the scene by deputy coroner Dr. Charles A. Callis at 12:05 p.m.

Dupler's body was reportedly found by a neighbor, after Dupler was apparently driving the tractor near an embankment when the wheels slipped on the wet grass and the tractor upset. Police estimated the accident occurred about 10:30 a.m., although Dupler was not found until some time later.

Born in Conoy Twp., he was the son of the late Henry C. and Harriet Miller Dupler and was married to the late Elsie Shenk Dupler, who died in October, 1970.

He was a member of Ruhl's United Methodist Church, Manheim RD4.

He is survived by the following sons and daughters: Esther, wife of George Halbleib, Elizabethtown; Ruth, wife of Mervin Shoemaker, Elizabethtown; Leroy Dupler,

Annaville; Walter Dupler, Harrisburg; Clyde Dupler, Bainbridge; Anna Mae, wife of Charles Fackler Sr., Annville.

Other sons and daughters include: Rhoda, wife of John Garman, Bainbridge, Naom wife of Clarence Oberholtze Elizabethtown; Melvin Dupler, Manheim; and Miss Stell Dupler, at home.

He is also survived by 4 grandchildren, 80 great grandchildren, two great-great grandchildren and a sister, Mrs. Martin W. Espenshade Elizabethtown RD4.

Pa. Broiler Placements Up 33 pct.

Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending October 20, 1973 were 1,432,000. The placements were 33 percent above the corresponding week a year earlier, and 12 percent above the previous week. Average placements during the past 14 weeks were 13 percent above a year earlier.

Settings for broiler chicks were 2,030,000 - 12 percent above the previous week and 33 percent above the comparable period a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 23 percent above the same period a year ago.

Inshipments of broiler-type chicks during the past 10 weeks averaged 26,000 compared with 18,000 a year ago. Outshipments averaged 286,000 during the past 10 weeks, 21 percent above a year earlier.

Placements in the 21 States were 55,655,000 - 2 percent below the previous week but 4 percent above the same week a year earlier. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were percent above a year ago.

Settings were 67,721,000 - 1 percent above the previous week but 2 percent below a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 2 percent below the comparable period a year ago.

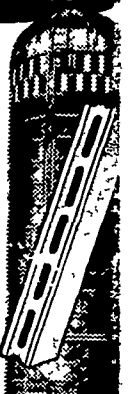
