James R. Miller of Conestoga, graduate assistant in entomology at The Pennsylvania State University was named winner of Graduate the Student Recognition Award of the Eastern Branch, Entomological Society of America, during the Society's annual meeting November 1 in New York City.

As the winner, Miller will receive \$100 and all expenses paid to attend the national meeting of the Entomological Society of America November 26 to 30 in Dallas, Texas. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Claude D. Miller of RD1, Conestoga.

An outstanding graduate student, Miller has been awarded Graduate School Fellowships annually during the past two years at Penn State. He also received the outstanding presentation award for graduate student competition at a Meeting in Minature sponsored in 1971 by the Central Pennsylvania Section of the American Chemical Society.

During the summer of 1971 he was awarded a fellowship to study invertebrate zoology at the Woods Hole Marine Biological Laboratories, Massachusetts.


