

Rough and Tumble Historical Assoc. Elects 1974 Officers, Directors

The Rough and Tumble Engineers Historical Association held its 13th annual membership banquet at the Blue Ball Fire Hall Saturday, October 27 with 275 persons in attendance. Following the invocation by Alfred Kutzner, welcome was extended by postmaster W. J. Eshleman.

President Daniel Brubaker gave the annual president's report. Highlights of the report included the financial report of the organization, plans for 1974, commending several members for promotional work for the past year, and thanking the entire membership for their efforts and devotion to the Rough and Tumble association during the past year.

Entomologists Honor Miller

James R. Miller of Conestoga, graduate assistant in entomology at The Pennsylvania State University was named winner of the Graduate Student Recognition Award of the Eastern Branch, Entomological Society of America, during the Society's annual meeting November 1 in New York City.

As the winner, Miller will receive \$100 and all expenses paid to attend the national meeting of the Entomological Society of America November 26 to 30 in Dallas, Texas. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Claude D. Miller of RD1, Conestoga.

An outstanding graduate student, Miller has been awarded Graduate School Fellowships annually during the past two years at Penn State. He also received the outstanding presentation award for graduate student competition at a Meeting in Miniature sponsored in 1971 by the Central Pennsylvania Section of the American Chemical Society.

During the summer of 1971 he was awarded a fellowship to study invertebrate zoology at the Woods Hole Marine Biological Laboratories, Massachusetts.

His research efforts at Penn State have produced a published paper and two presentations at scientific meetings. A second Penn State research paper is now being printed. He also published two research papers as a result of undergraduate studies at Millersville State College where he received the bachelor of arts degree in biology in 1970.

Considered an exceptional scholar by the faculty in entomology at Penn State, Miller has compiled an academic average of 3.95 out of a possible 4.0 in graduate school.

He is vice-president of the Pennsylvania State Entomological Association and is a member of the Pennsylvania

Academy of Science and the Entomological Society of America. He has presented talks on pesticides and insect control to secondary school classes in the State College area.

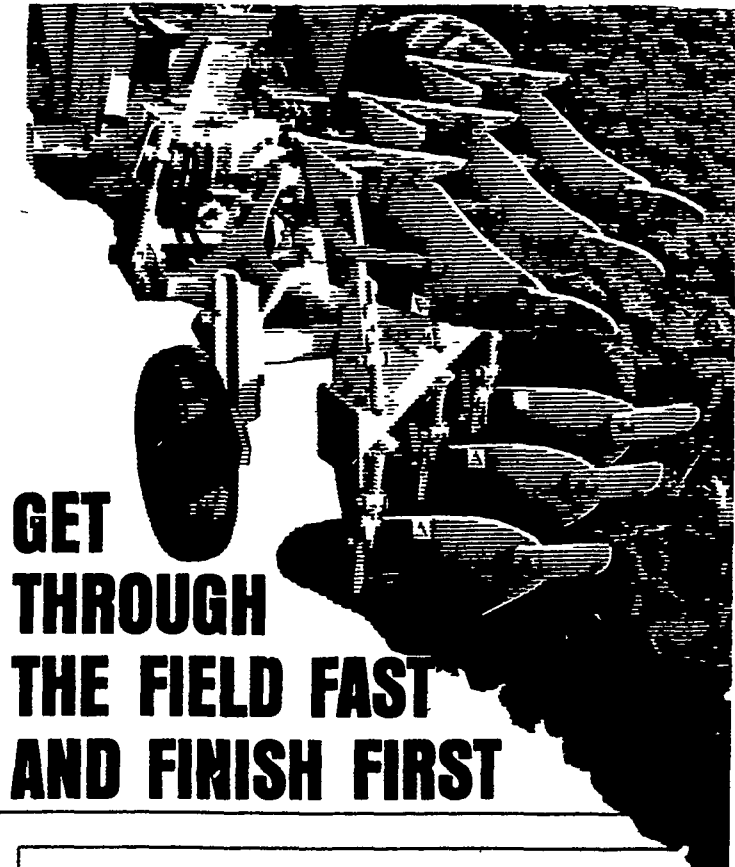

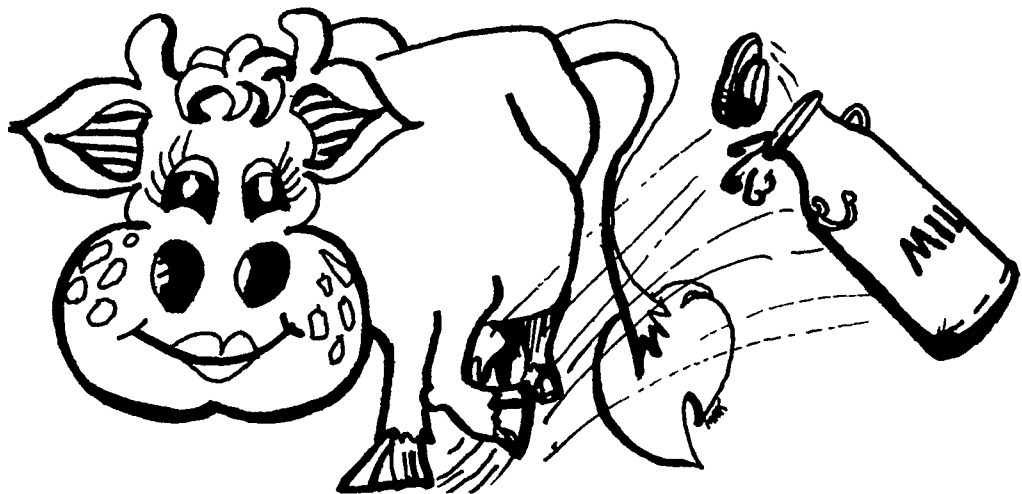

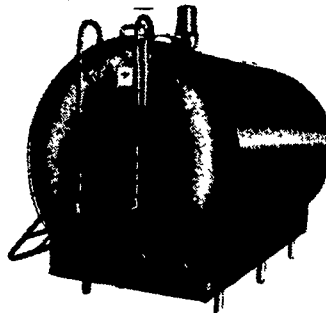
