Thought For Food



Batter Corn "Popsicle"

Sift ½ cup flour with ½ tea spoon baking powder, ½ teaspoon sugar, ½ teaspoon salt, and 1/16 teaspoon ground black pepper. Thoroughly combine ½ cup milk with 1 egg yolk and 1 teaspoon salad oil. Add to flour mixture, blend well. Let batter stand at room temperature for 20 minutes. Meanwhile, husk 12 ears fresh Florida corn, cut corn ears in half. Beat 1 egg white until stiff, but not dry. Fold into batter. Dust corn with flour, shake off excess. Dip corn into batter. Fry in deep fat heated to 350°F for 3 to 5 minutes or until nicely browned. Serve on sticks as a "popsicle." Yield 6 portions.

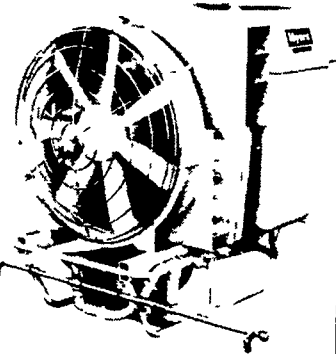

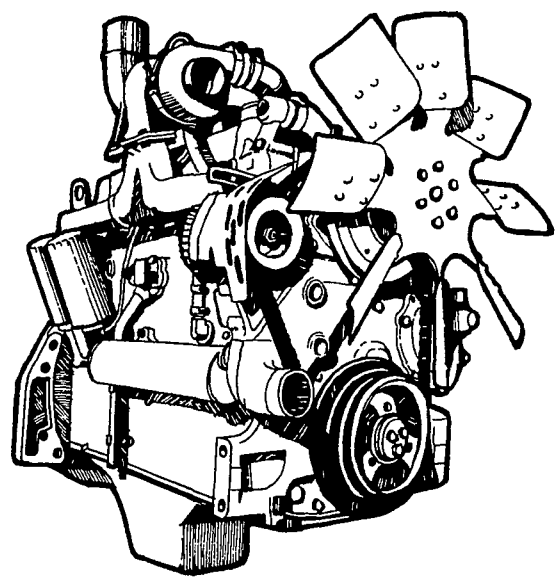
