membership at its annual meeting elected the following directors for a 3-year term: Warren R. Baker, Middletown, Del.; John A. Ricca, Billerica, Mass.; Richard Stark, Walpole, N. H.; Henry Mayerfeld, Norma, N. J., and Donald Moorefield, Shady Springs, W. Va.

President Wentink reported on a meeting he had earlier in the week with the staff of U. S. Senator Richard S. Schweiker in Washington regarding the "very real need to get across to the American people the story on the nutritional benefits of eggs and egg products."

"In an era in which many of our citizens are suffering nutritionally, it is vital that the egg industry have a platform from which to promulgate the truth -- the facts which are often misrepresented -- concerning the

healthful values represented by eggs to the consumer. The American Egg Board and the National Council on Egg Nutrition are two excellent groups for providing this service."

Wentink made a reference to a letter received from Senator Schweiker just prior to the exposition in which the legislator stated, "I believe the Food and Drug Administration has an absolute duty to insure the American consumer does not receive misinformation

in this area.

"I am looking into the possibility of hearings at which it would be possible to correct publically the misimpressions which have been created about eggs and poultry products."

Wentink was accompanied at Schweiker's office by Robert H. Horsburgh, Doylestown, Pa., NEPPCO treasurer and director, and by Norman Hecht, a director of the New York State Poultry Industry Coordinated Effort (SPICE).
