Texas-Oklahoma: First part of week partly sunny and very warm; heavy rain in central region and along Gulf latter part.

Rocky Mountain Region: Week begins cloudy, then heavy snowfall in central and north; light snow latter part, then some clearing.

Southwest Desert: Clear and warm at first, then increasing cloudiness, light rain and cooler; heavy rain end of week. Pacific Northwest: Rain to start, then clearing and cold with 20-25" snow in mountains; end of week clear and cool in south, light rain in north.

California: Rain, heavy to start, and cool with snow in mountains, then partial clearing; end of week cool in north and warmer in south.
