

Garden Spot Young Farmers To Meet

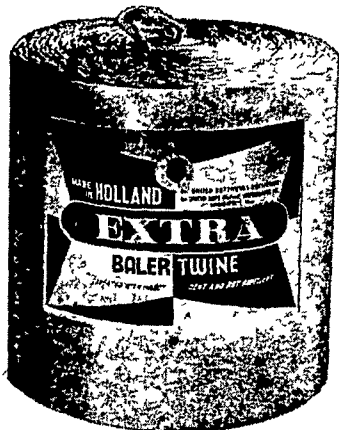

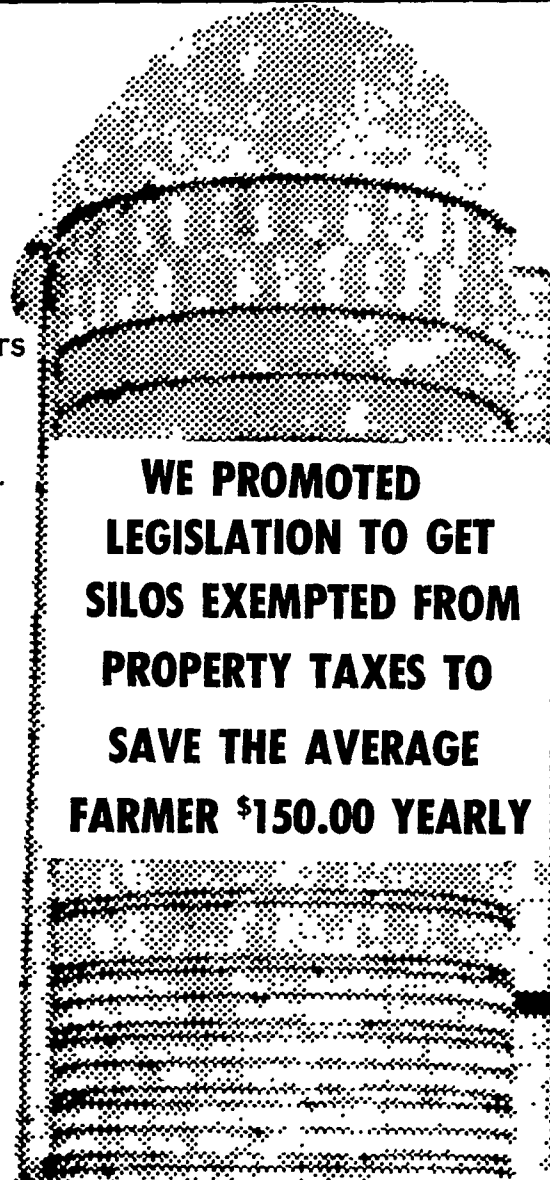
