

#### Get Ewes Ready

A little attention to the ewe flock in December may prevent costly diseases and parasite losses this winter says Dr Samuel B. Guss, Extension veterinarian at The Pennsylvania State University. He suggests worming the flock, examining winter feeding and watering facilities, spraying to eliminate losses from external parasites, cleaning lambing pens, checking housing and bedding, and setting aside a month's cupply of the best hay to feed ewes in the period just before lambing.
