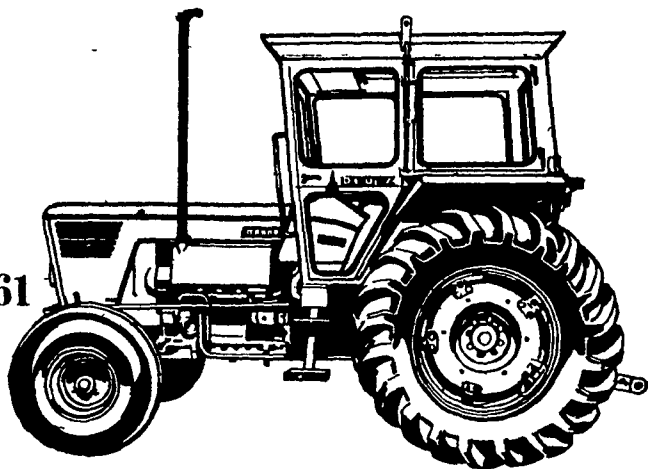
Paradise RD1, is currently Parliamentarian of Solanco FFA.

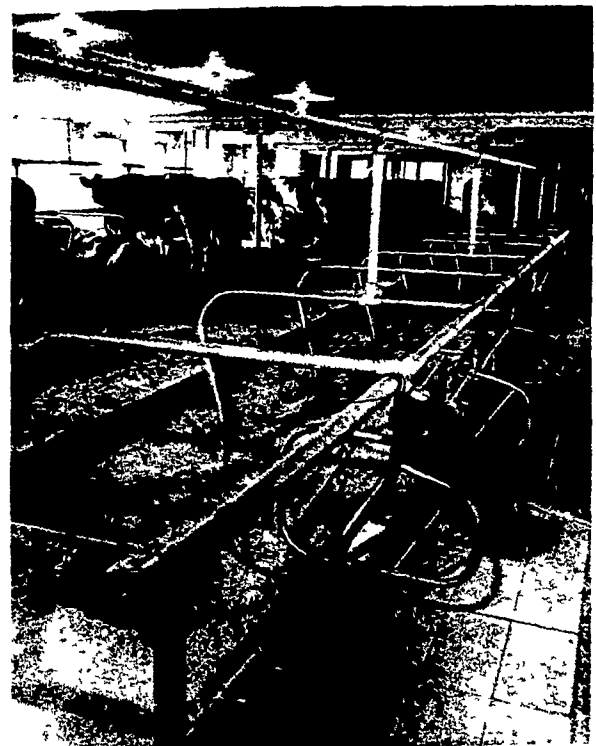
