take the Pennsylvania citizens to Norway, Denmark, Sweden, Finland, the Soviet Union, Poland and Switzerland.

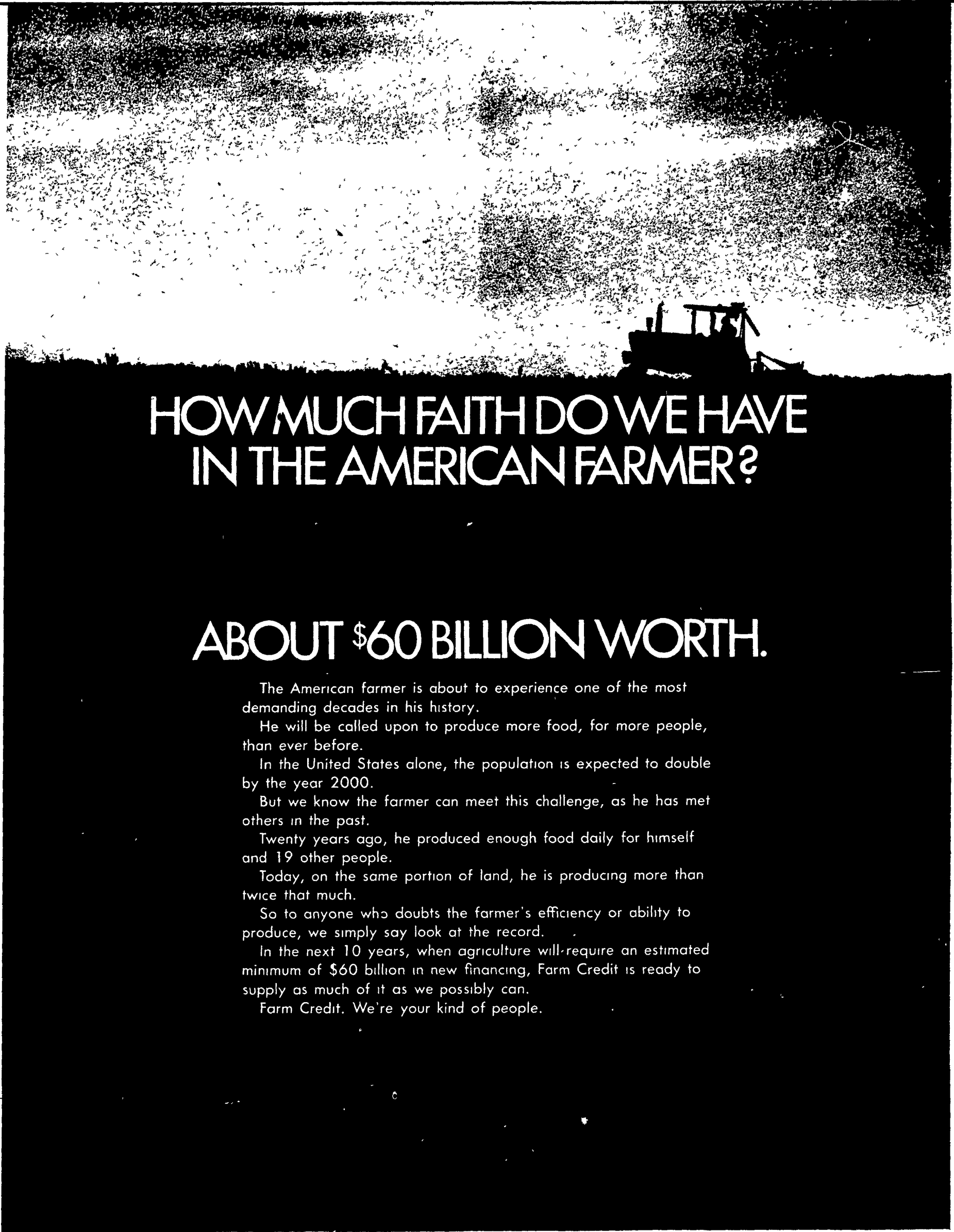
