U.S., Pa. Potato Stock

Stocks of potatoes stored in Pennsylvania on January 1, 1974 totaled 2,400,000 hundredweight (cwt.) according to the Crop Reporting Service. This is 14 percent more than the record low stocks a year earlier.

These stocks represent potatoes held for all uses by Pennsylvania growers, local dealers and processors.

Total U.S. stocks on January 1, 1974 was 128.9 million cwt., four percent less than the 134.3 million cwt. on hand a year earlier. Disappearance from the 1973 fall production of 252.0 million cwt. to January 1, 1974 totaled 123.1 million cwt., eight percent more than the 114.5 million

marketed during the comparable period a year earlier.

Seminars Scheduled

Farmers and ranchers from 15 states are expected to participate in a marketing and management seminar at Decatur, Illinois February 21-22. The seminar is sponsored by Professional Farmers of America.

The objective of the seminar is to update farmer knowledge on the food and energy crises, to improve their managerial skills, and to give producers from various parts of the nation an opportunity to exchange profit ideas for 1974.

Dec. Milk Base Price Is Up 23¢

The December uniform price for base milk increased 23 cents to \$9.30 from the

previous month according to Andrew G. Marvin, local field representative for Inter-State Milk Producers Cooperative. Excess milk showed a decrease of 5 cents to \$6.90.

In comparison to December levels one year ago base milk was up \$1.98 and excess up \$1.40. The weighted average price for the market was increased by \$1.95, above December 1972.

A total of 377.1 million pounds of producer milk was pooled in December of which 63.16 percent was sold as Class I, showing a decrease of 6.16 percent of deliveries made in November, and a decrease of 1.7 percent under December a year ago. 7897 Order No. 4 producers provided 12.16 million pounds per day to dealers during December, averaging 1541 pounds per day per farm.

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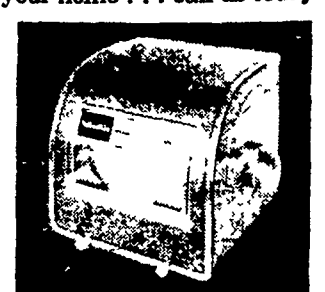
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
