

Guernsey Breeders Hold Annual Meeting

Fifty-three dairymen attended the Lebanon-Berks-Schuylkill-Dauphin Guernsey Breeders Association Annual Meeting on Jan. 19 at the Stouchsburg Lutheran Church. The program featured a film "Behind These Doors", produced by Readers Digest films. The film is a graphic portrayal of how agriculture and its related food industries manage to move nearly one billion pounds of food to market each day.

William Juzi, Business Manager of the Pennsylvania Guernsey Breeders Association was among the guests at the meeting. He announced that he would be retiring from his position this year after 50 years of service to the Guernsey industry in Pennsylvania. He

will be succeeded by John Blyholder, Field Man for the Guernsey Breeders Association, who will take over the post later this year.

Lee Yost, reported the rather startling fact that the Grand Champion Guernsey at the 1974 Farm Show had produced an annual record of over 21,000 pounds of milk.

Good Guernsey cattle are now selling at higher prices than ever before, reflecting the high demand for the fewer high quality animals that are available. National Director Raymond Witmer of Lancaster reported that while registrations of purebred Guernseys are down 12 percent, the demand for high quality animals is increasing.

The four-county Guernsey organization will be headed this year by Robert Smith, RD1, Annville, the newly elected president. Other officers elected at Saturday's meeting are: Warren Bucher, RD2, Myerstown, vice president; Carl Hollenbach, secretary; and Lloyd Dreibebis, treasurer. Warren Bucher, outgoing president, presided over the meeting.

Special 4-H Farm Show awards were given to Jeff Smith, Frank Oellig, Bonita Oellig, Dale Smith and David Smith. Recognition for excellence in FFA Guernsey projects was given to Marlin Dietrich, Jacob Leiby and Bruce Maulfair.
