



Four day receipts 18,500 as compared 25,600 previous week and 15,700 a year ago. Slaughter steers approximately 45 percent, heifers 32 percent, overall finish attractive although many carrying considerable mud. Cows 12 percent,

feeders 5 percent. Fed cattle prices continued to follow a very erratic pattern with wide day-to-day fluctuations. A Monday run of only 3300 sparked a sharp upturn in forced trading as buyers scrambled for numbers to meet immediate requirements, However, much of the advance on steers was lost as supplies expanded and there was a growing concern over the availability of transportation facilities for moving the finished product eastward, and particularly beyond Chicago.
