

Easter Seal Society '74 Goal is \$67,000

The Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults of Lancaster County has announced that its 1974 fund raising campaign will be held Friday, March 1, through Easter Sunday, April 14. The society hopes to raise \$67,000 during the campaign to continue its rehabilitation work with Lancaster County's handicapped children and adults.

No door-to-door soliciting is conducted during the Easter Seal drive. As in past campaigns, this year's drive will rely on mailed-in contributions backed by returns

from Buck-A-Cup Coffee Day, which is sponsored annually by the Lancaster County Restaurant Association.

Named to head this year's campaign are Philip L. Rife, RD2, Lititz, and Maurice M. R. Thomas, 790 Stony Battery Road, Landisville. Rife is an employee communications supervisor for Armstrong Cork Company, and Thomas is a manager in Armstrong's training and development section.

Other members of the 1974 campaign committee announced are: Thomas S. Werlinich and David M.

Hetu, advertising; Robert R. Black and Elaine Terranova, art; Larry W. Sipe, Buck-A-Cup; A. J. Pryzbykowski, production; Richard B. Sinclair, publicity; and Eric Berman, radio and television.

Last year the Easter Seal Rehabilitation Center treated more than 2,000 Lancaster County children and adults. This year's campaign proceeds will go to support a wide range of Easter Seal programs including physical, speech and occupational therapy, amputee services, an orthopedic clinic, a rehabilitation clinic, a cerebral palsy clinic, electrodiagnostic services, a preschool developmental program, a horsemanship program for handicapped children, a swimming program; a summer camp, boys' and girls' scouting groups, a comprehensive information and volunteer service program, an equipment loan service, and art, group and craft therapy for adults.

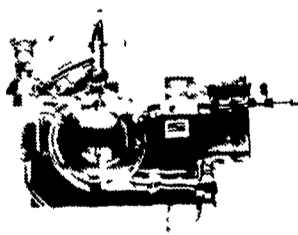

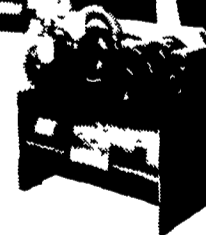

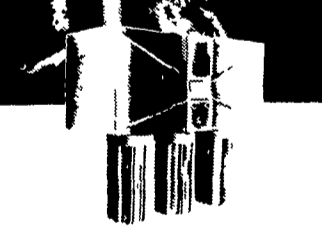
