Streams Law Discussed At Hinkletown Meet

meetings sponsored by the Eastern Lancaster County Adult Farmer Program will be held on Wednesday evening, Feb. 27, at 7:30 in the Hinkletown Elementary School just off Route 322 near Martindale. This meeting will center upon a discussion of the Clean Streams Law and how it affects the farmers of Lancaster County. Members of the panel to discuss this law will include George Parks, Consultant for the Water Quality Board of the Department of Environmental Resources; District Orval Bass, Conservationist for the Lancaster County Soil and Water Conservation Service; and Henry Hackman, Executive Secretary of the Lancaster County Soil Conservation District.

The State of Pennsylvania has recently passed a Clean Streams Law which has provisions which must be met by every farmer no later than July 1, 1977 and these provisions affect each and every farmer of Lancaster County. Among the topics which will be covered in the discussion by the panel are: The requirements of the new law; how these requirements can best be met by the local farmers; the types of help available to the farmer; and the time requirements and penalties of the new law.

No farmer can afford to remain uninformed about
