State Giving Exams for Real Estate Specialists

State civil service examinations for four levels of real estate specialists will be given until further notice, the State Civil Service Commission said.

SCSC director Richard A. Rosenberry said examinations for real estate specialist I-IV are held daily at the Commission offices in Harrisburg. Daily tests are by appointment only and require advance arrangements with the office at which the test will be administered.

Those applying for real estate specialist I-III must have had one to three years of technical real estate experience in addition to the two years of college. Applicants for real estate specialist IV must have a bachelor's degree plus three

years of experience in technical real estate work.

Equivalent combinations of experience and training may be accepted. Applicants are advised to obtain copies of the examination announcement for specific details on position requirements and acceptable combinations of experience and training.

Applicants for all levels except the real estate specialist IV must possess a current, valid driver's license.

Applicants, examination announcements, and further information may be obtained from State Civil Service Commission office in Harrisburg, or from local offices of the Pennsylvania State Employment Service.

Bike Lanes Save Fuel

Bicycles, long admired by fitness fans, now are getting loving looks from gas-shy commuters as well.

If one out of every 10 commuters traveling an average of six miles switched from his car to a bike, five billion gallons of gasoline could be saved every year, says The Road Information Program (TRIP).

Of every 50 commuters, one uses a bicycle and 40 use a car. The others walk or use some form of public transit.

At present, there are few bicycle commuters because they must compete with cars and trucks on congested streets, says the

Washington-based research agency. Narrow shoulders and bad road surfaces also spell trouble for the cyclist, TRIP points out.

If separate bike paths were built and shoulders on existing roads improved, TRIP says, the number of bicycle commuters would increase. The agency says expenditures for construction and improvement of bike ways are justified by increased safety and fuel savings.

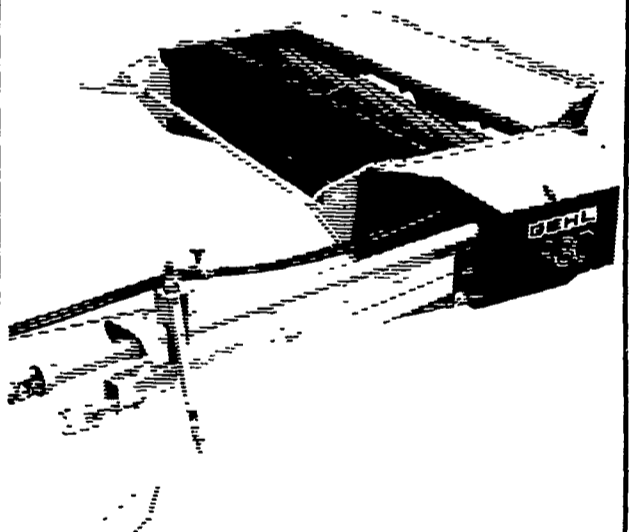
