Dear Livestock Farmer:

Dr. Cloy Knodt tells us that a ton of good quality alfalfa haylage containing_ 40% moisture and 20% crude protein on a dry matter basis can be an excellent source of protein and considerable economic value. Such haylage contains enough crude protein to equal that of 545 lbs. of 44% protein soybean meal which would cost \$54.50 (\$200.00 per ton) or \$65.40 (\$240.00 per ton). Therefore, alfalfa haylage can easily be worth \$50 to \$65 per ton just for its crude protein value as compared to buying soybean meal.


