

# NEPPCO Turkey Conference Scheduled For March 20

The NEPPCO Mid Atlantic Turkey Conference will be held in the Sheraton Inn, Gettysburg, Pa., on Wednesday, March 20, starting at 10:00 a.m.

The Conference is sponsored by the Turkey Divisions of the Northeastern Poultry Producers Council (NEPPCO) and the Pennsylvania Poultry Federation. All interested persons, whether members of either sponsoring organization or not, are welcome to attend.

"The gasoline shortage

need not deter turkeymen from attending this Conference," reports NEPPCO's Executive Director, Richard Ammon. "Arrangements have been made so that those traveling a distance will be able to obtain fuel in the Gettysburg area for the return trip."

Lead-off speaker on the Conference program will be Pierre Boucher, chief of the Marketing Programs Branch of the Poultry Division of USDA, who will present the "Outlook for Turkeys this Year". Boucher

was formerly executive secretary of the Massachusetts Poultry Association. Since joining USDA, he has been involved with the preparation of the "Turkey Guides". He currently heads the government's turkey procurement program and the collection and analysis of turkey marketing statistics nationally.

Following Boucher's talk, attendees will have the choice of two concurrent workshops. The Production Workshop under the direction of Dr. Gordon B. Meyer of VPI&SU will cover such subjects as housing, insulation, brooding & management, while the Processing & Marketing Workshop will tackle inspection and other government regulations, shelf life of fresh dressed birds, freezing, freeze-drying and packaging.

Bill Shepard, newly elected president of the National Turkey Federation and general manager of Goldsboro Milling Co., Goldsboro, NC, will be guest speaker at the luncheon.

"The Other Side of the Case" is the title of an intriguing dual presentation on the afternoon program. The "Case" referred to is the in-store refrigerated turkey display case. Ms. Mary Hochendorner, consumer specialist for the Pennsylvania Dept. of Agriculture, will give "The

Consumer Point of View"; and Charles Radle, a Pennsylvania food inspector, will discuss "The Inspection Point of View".

Anchor man on the Conference program will be Dr. Loren Nichols, turkey nutritionist with Central Soya Co., Inc., of Decatur, Indiana, who will discuss the balancing of amino acids in feeds and the formulation of

least-cost feeds with today's high-priced ingredients in a talk entitled, "Optimum Profit Turkey Feeding".

# Merger Approved

Two long-established savings and loan associations in Reading have merged to become Wyomissing Provident Federal Savings and Loan. Receipt of approval of the merger by the Federal Home Loan Bank board was announced jointly by George B. Gaul, president of Wyomissing Federal Savings, and Marlin G. Kachel, Provident Federal president.

Gaul stated that the single institution will be the largest savings association in Berks County with assets of approximately \$90 million. He noted that increased investment opportunities will be offered to customers, and the ability to finance homes in Berks County will be expanded.

# Hearing on Milk Dating Rules Set

HARRISBURG - Pennsylvania Agriculture Secretary Jim McHale has announced that a hearing on milk dating requirements will be held on March 26 beginning at 10 a.m. here at the Agriculture Building in Room 309.

The hearing concerns proposed amendments to the state's milk sanitation regulations that would provide for uniform dating requirements on milk containers and improve the testing requirements and standards for abnormal milk.

The Department of Agriculture has been developing uniform milk sanitation standards since local municipalities were prohibited from writing differing regulations under Act 120, signed into law in 1972. Standards already

adopted include maximum storage and transportation temperatures for milk.

By adopting statewide uniform milk sanitation standards, Pennsylvania has been able to enter into reciprocal inspection agreements with other states. This has meant that farmers selling milk across state lines have not been subject to multiple inspections and costly fees.

McHale said the hearing on proposals to stamp maximum milk sale dates on containers stems from requests by certain consumer groups during the year to adopt dating requirements. Milk industry spokesmen say they have used voluntary dating
