Farm Women Society 25 met Saturday, Mar. 9 at the home of Mrs. Wade Groff. Mrs. Sterling Elmer led the devotions.

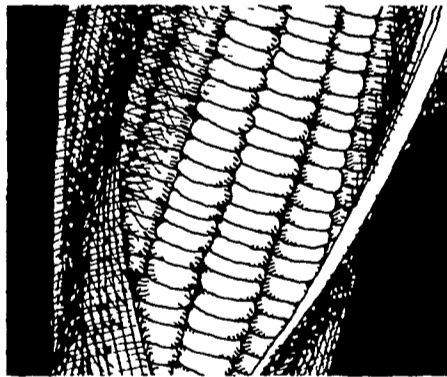
