If the taxpayer has rein vested the proceeds of the
sale in another house, cooperative apartment or condominium costing or least as much as the selling price of the one disposed of, there is no immediate problem; the capital gain tax is deferred untll the gain is actually realized.
To qualify for such a tax deferral, the new home must be purchased - and occupied - within 12 months of the sale of the old one. If the replacement home is being constructed by the taxpayer, the time limit is extended to 18 months.
What happens when a taxpayer finally gives up home ownership in favor of moving in with the children or renting? -Then the tax on the previously untaxed capital gains on homes owned earlier must finally be pald. But for many taxpayers this comes after retirement, when tax rates
