

Viticultural research to be carried out by Dr. Haeseler will include continuing evaluation of promising wine grape cultivars at various locations in the state and evaluation of cultural practices which might overcome weaknesses of desirable cultivars. Other studies will concern search for economical procedures for bench grafting and techniques for post-grafting management.

Enological research to be carried out by Dr. Robert Beelman, Assistant Professor of Food Science Technology, will include the making of wine from the more promising cultivars. Quality measurements will be made of musts and finished wines. Organoleptic ratings will be made.

Entomological research to be carried out by Dr. Gerald L. Jubb, Assistant Professor of Entomology, will involve laboratory and field experiments on control of important insect and mite pests, including chemical and biological methods. Life history and biological studies will be conducted



The project will also identify fungal, bacterial and virus diseases prevalent in Pennsylvania wine grape vineyards and develop methods of controlling these diseases.

Significant accomplishments of Penn State's wine grape research to date have been establishment of demonstration vineyards in Erie, Adams, Bucks, Franklin and Lancaster counties. Some of the most promising cultivars in these studies have been Chelois, Chancellor, De Chaunac, Seyval Blanc and Vidal Blanc. Also recommendations have been developed for control of aerial grape phylloxera and grape erineum mite in addition to recommendations on cultural practices. Finally, it has been demonstrated that commercially acceptable wines can be produced from the 5 commercially recommended wine cultivars listed above.
