U. S. soybean plantings are projected to total 52.9 Department of Agriculture million acres in 1974, 7.6 forecast there would be 3.3 percent less than a year ago, percent fewer soybean acres according to an American in 1974. The USDA, who set Soybean Assn. (ASA) planting intentions survey acres, plans to release conducted in late February.

If the projected decline materializes, it would be the first drop in soybean acreage since 1959. The survey sampled soybean producers in 24 soybean producing states.

A breakdown of the projected plantings shows: Eastern Corn Belt growers-Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Michigan and Wisconsin-will plant 4.5 percent fewer beans;

Western Corn growers-Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, North Dakota, Nebraska and Kansas-will plant 11.8 percent fewer beans;

Southern producers--Arkansas, Mississippi, Louisiana, Texas, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Kentucky and Alabama-will plant 8.5 percent fewer beans;

East Coast producers--Virginia, Maryland, South Carolina, North Carolina and Georgia-will plant 1.5 percent more beans. The East Coast is the only area where projections indicate a possible increase in soybean acreage.

The 7.6 percent projected decrease in soybean plantings is smaller than the 10.1 percent projected decrease predicted by a similar ASA survey made in December.

A jump in doublecropped 1973. soybeans was also indicated by soybean growers participating in the survey. The increase will apparently be about the same as the growers' increase in wheat acreage, which is up approximately 75 percent from Southern states.


