Easter Candy
 4 ounces cream cheese
 1/4 cup butter
 1 tablespoon milk or water
 Mix with mixer and add 1 1/2 pounds 10X sugar. Divide mixture into 3 parts if desired and add:
 1 cup peanut butter to one part
 1 cup coconut to one part
 Few drops peppermint to one part
 Add more 10X sugar if needed so it is not too sticky to shape into pieces. Let set 1/2 hour to harden.
 Melt over hot water, to

coat approximately 100 pieces:
 1 pound chocolate
 1/4 pound paraffin
 Coat large marshmallows with any remaining chocolate if desired.

Macaroni Salad
 Boil together:
 2 cups sugar
 1 1/2 cups water
 1 1/2 cups vinegar
 1 tablespoon mustard
 2 tablespoons flour
 2 tablespoons butter
 4 eggs, beaten
 1 1/2 teaspoons salt

Boil two minutes, till thickened. Add 1 1/2 cups mayonnaise when cool.

 4 hard cooked eggs
 2 cups chopped celery
 2 small onions, diced
 1 cup shredded carrots

Batter Dip Chicken
 Cook one young chicken until soft.
Batter:
 1 cup flour
 1 teaspoon baking powder
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 egg
 1/2 cup milk

Mix all ingredients together. Take the meaty pieces and dip them in the batter and deep fry until light brown. Drain on paper.

Hamburger Casserole
 1 pound hamburger
 1/2 package noodles, cooked
 1 can whole kernel corn
 1 can cream of mushroom soup
 1 can cream of chicken soup
 1/2 cup wheat flake cereal, crushed
 Brown hamburger (and onion if desired) in shortening. Stir in noodles, corn, soups, salt and pepper. Pour into lightly greased casserole. Sprinkle with

wheat flakes. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Serves 6 to 8.

Veinary Pudding
 2 cups milk
 1 package gelatine (unflavored)


