Pa. Broiler **Placements** Rise 3 pct.

Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending March 23, 1974 were 1,387,000. The placements were 3 percent above the corresponding week a year earlier, and 25 percent above the previous week. Average placements during the past 10 weeks were 4 percent above a year earlier.

Settings for broiler chicks were 1,763,000 - 12 percent below the previous week and 7 percent below the comparable period a year earlier. The current 3-week total of eggs set is 7 percent below the same period a year

Eastern Pa. & N.J.

Wednesday, March 27 Prices mostly 1 cent lower on light type hens. Demand light for barely adequate supplies as plants generally operating only part time. Advance bookings in April generally heavy. Offerings of heavy type hens adequate
