

New Family Health Center Now Open

The Southern Lancaster County Family Health Center of the Lancaster General Hospital is now treating patients at its new facilities located at 317 South Chestnut Street, Quarryville. Since its inception in October, 1971, the Center had been located at 1 East Fourth Street in the building which formerly served as the consistory of St. Paul's United Church of Christ. The move to larger quarters has

been necessitated by the increase in patients and need for additional treatment space.

The purpose of the Center is to provide comprehensive health care to the families in the Solanco area, placing emphasis on preventative medicine and total health care for patients and their families. Under the direction of Herbert L. Tindall, M.D. and Nikitas J. Zervanos, M.D., Associate Director

and Director, respectively, of the Family and Community Medicine Program, it is staffed by physicians in the Family Practice Residency Program of the Hospital.

By the end of February, 1974, 6,744 patients had made 26,048 visits to the Center. 2,087 families are registered with the Center for their total medical care.

The new facilities double the amount of rooms available for treating patients. Whereas the former facilities provided six clinical rooms, there are ten permanent examining and treatment rooms in the new center with two additional rooms available for this purpose during peak hours. An additional room has been added for physiotherapy, electrocardiograms, and other clinical activities. Another room has been designated for counseling and family therapy.

Another innovative feature of the new Center is the patient education room. Here patients are counseled on the nature of their health problem and its proper treatment. Instructional

booklets and other patient education material will be available there. Also, modern audio visual equipment will be used in this room to instruct patients on certain aspects of health care.

Hours at the Center remain the same, which are by appointment from 10:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M. on weekdays. At other times, one of the Center's physicians will be available at the Center for emergency consultation or will be on constant radio page in the event that he must leave the Center. The practice is covered 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, with one or more physicians present at the Center 20 hours out of each day, and a doctor on call at all times.

The telephone number for the Center remains the same, 786-7383.

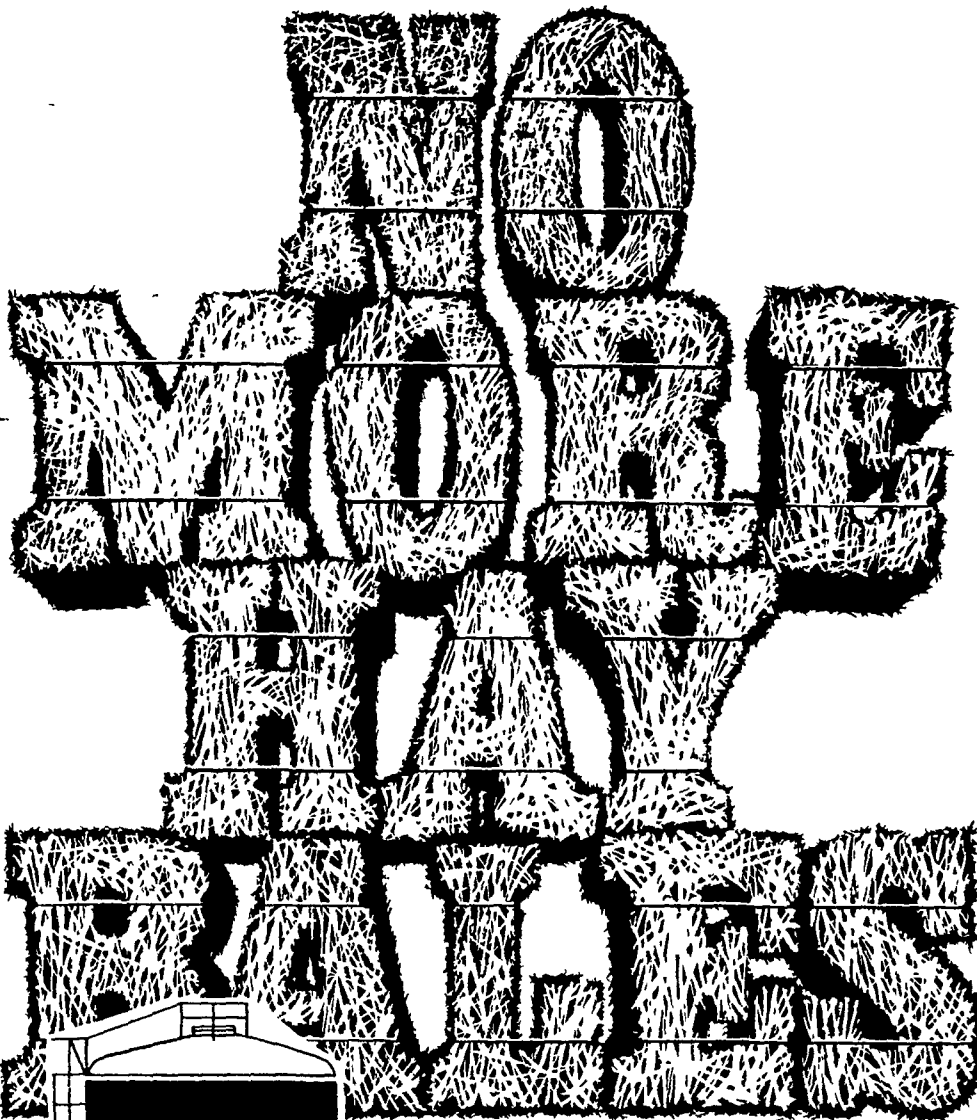

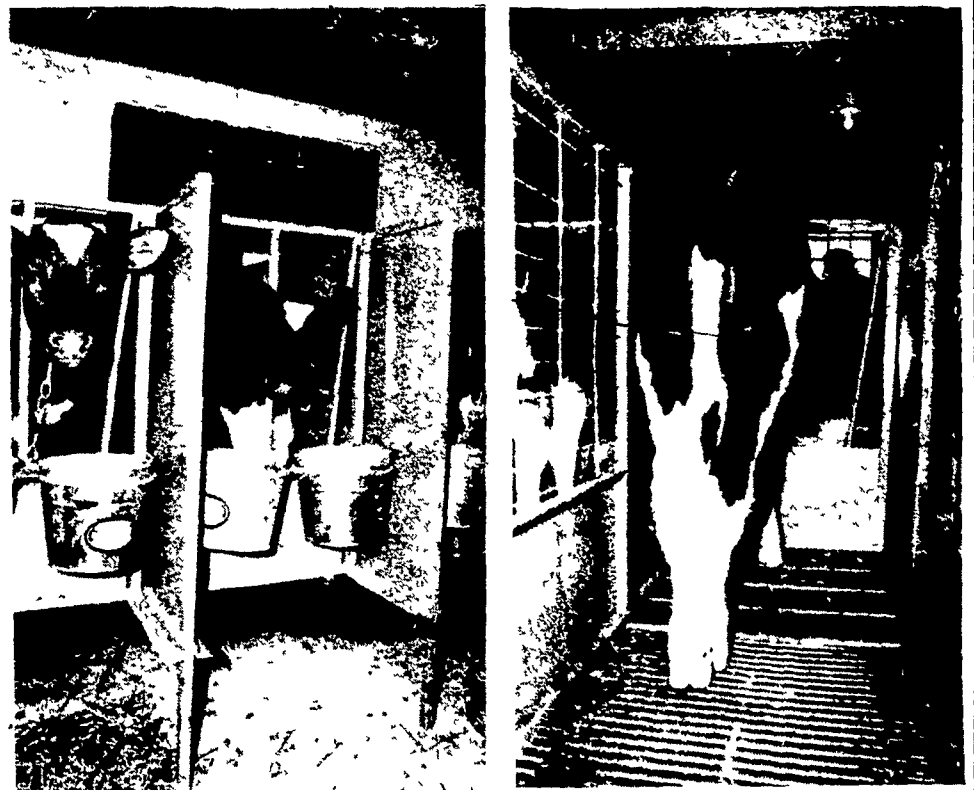
